## Pennsylvania Clean Economy Snapshot

**More than 87,000 Pennsylvanians** already work in clean energy jobs (11th in the country).

**Nearly 8,000 PA workers** manufacture or service zero emissions trucks and buses -- 10th among all states.

Electric vehicles already account for **7,600 Pennsylvania jobs**, and there are **17,530 EVs** on the roads in PA.

Congress is considering clean energy investments that would provide **\$9.3 billion** in funding for energy efficiency in Pennsylvania and **create more than 144,000 Pennsylvania jobs over five years, contributing \$11.2 billion to the state's GDP.**

**16 separate Pennsylvania companies** are part of the national manufacturing and servicing supply chain for zero emissions trucks and buses, the 15th highest in the nation.

Renewable energy would also **save the average Pennsylvania household \$500 a year.**
