

## The Trump Record: A Betrayal of Public Health & Environmental Protection

EDF and EDF Action have spent the last two years defending decades of environmental progress against a historically unprecedented assault by the Trump administration. This is a partial list of the areas where the administration has attempted to undermine public health protections.

**Overall:** Broadly attacking environmental safeguards

**Climate** – Withdrawing from Paris climate agreement, leaving the United States isolated in the world.

**Climate** – Suppressing science, removing climate data from government websites, appointing climate skeptics.

**Climate** – Attacking federal <u>clean cars standards</u>, which will lead to billions of tons of additional carbon pollution.

**Climate** – Attacking <u>well-established state authority</u> to carry out strong clean car standards, a long-standing driver of progress in addressing pollution from cars and trucks.

**Climate** – Attacking the <u>Clean Power Plan</u> and other climate pollution limits for power plants.

**Climate** – Seeking to <u>undermine</u> climate science and the national security community's assessment of the danger to military bases, troops, and readiness.

**Climate** – The president's <u>rhetoric doubting</u> climate science and impacts.

**Climate** – <u>Gutting</u> oil and gas pollution standards.



**Climate** – Trying to <u>delay</u> standards to reduce methane pollution from landfills.

**Clean Air** – Seeking to undermine the foundation of the <u>Mercury and Air</u> <u>Toxics Standards</u>, which save more than 10,000 lives a year.

**Clean Air** – Creating a <u>toxics loophole</u>, that will allow industrial facilities to increase their emissions of toxic air pollutants like benzene, lead, and mercury.

**Clean Air** – Attacking <u>pollution limits</u> for super-polluting heavy-duty diesel freight trucks.

**Clean Air** – <u>Undermining good neighbor</u> protections (downwind areas hurt by smog).

**Clean Air** – Attempting to undermine expert review and <u>implementation</u> of ozone standards.

**Clean Air** – Attacking <u>protections</u> that require large industrial sources to install modern pollution controls when they are expanding operations and increasing pollution levels.

**Clean Air** – <u>Dramatically reducing</u> environmental enforcement by EPA.

**Science** – Broadly attacking science on <u>air quality standards</u>, including for soot & smog.

**Science** – <u>Installing</u> industry insiders to lead science boards.

**Science** – Seeking to <u>restrict</u> EPA's ability to rely on the best available science when setting standards to protect human health and the environment.



**Community Safety** – <u>Proposing loopholes</u> in long-standing protections under the National Environmental Policy Act that would put communities at risk and worsen climate change.

**Open Government** – <u>Advancing limits</u> on public input to EPA's internal Environmental Appeals Board, a key forum for communities to seek review of EPA decisions.

**Health** – Illegal and dramatically <u>imbalanced</u> implementation of the new <u>TSCA</u> law, allowing chemical industry insiders to write rules, approving potentially dangerous chemicals for the market.

**Health** – Suppressing important health studies on chemicals like formaldehyde.

**Health** – Proposing a <u>weak</u> lead action plan without clear goals, funding, or deadlines.

**Fisheries** – <u>Illegally extending</u> the private recreational fishing season for Gulf of Mexico red snapper without proper scientific analysis, causing fishing to exceed catch limits and further delay to the stock's recovery.

**Wildlife** – <u>Undermining</u> a historic 2015 agreement between 10 states and the federal government to protect Greater Sage-Grouse and keep the bird off of the Endangered Species list.

**Wildlife** – Eliminating <u>compensatory mitigation</u> at the Bureau of Land Management, a critical tool that actually provides for economic growth and protection of the environment and species.

**Wildlife** – Continuing to propose <u>budgets that slash funding</u> for the Fish and Wildlife Service and National Marine Fisheries Service.

**Conservation** – Continuing to propose budgets that <u>slash funding</u> for the US Department of Agriculture conservation programs that improve soil health and water quality in critical watersheds across the country.



**EPA Budget** – Repeatedly recommending <u>nearly 1/3</u><sup>rd</sup> <u>cuts to EPA's budget</u>, which would eviscerate the agency's ability to protect public health.

**Lobbyist Influence** – Appointing industry <u>lobbyists</u> and industry insiders to key positions, including head of EPA and Secretary of the Interior.

**Secrecy** – Operating without transparency including suppressing previously public materials like key <u>analytic models</u> and senior officials' <u>calendars</u>.
